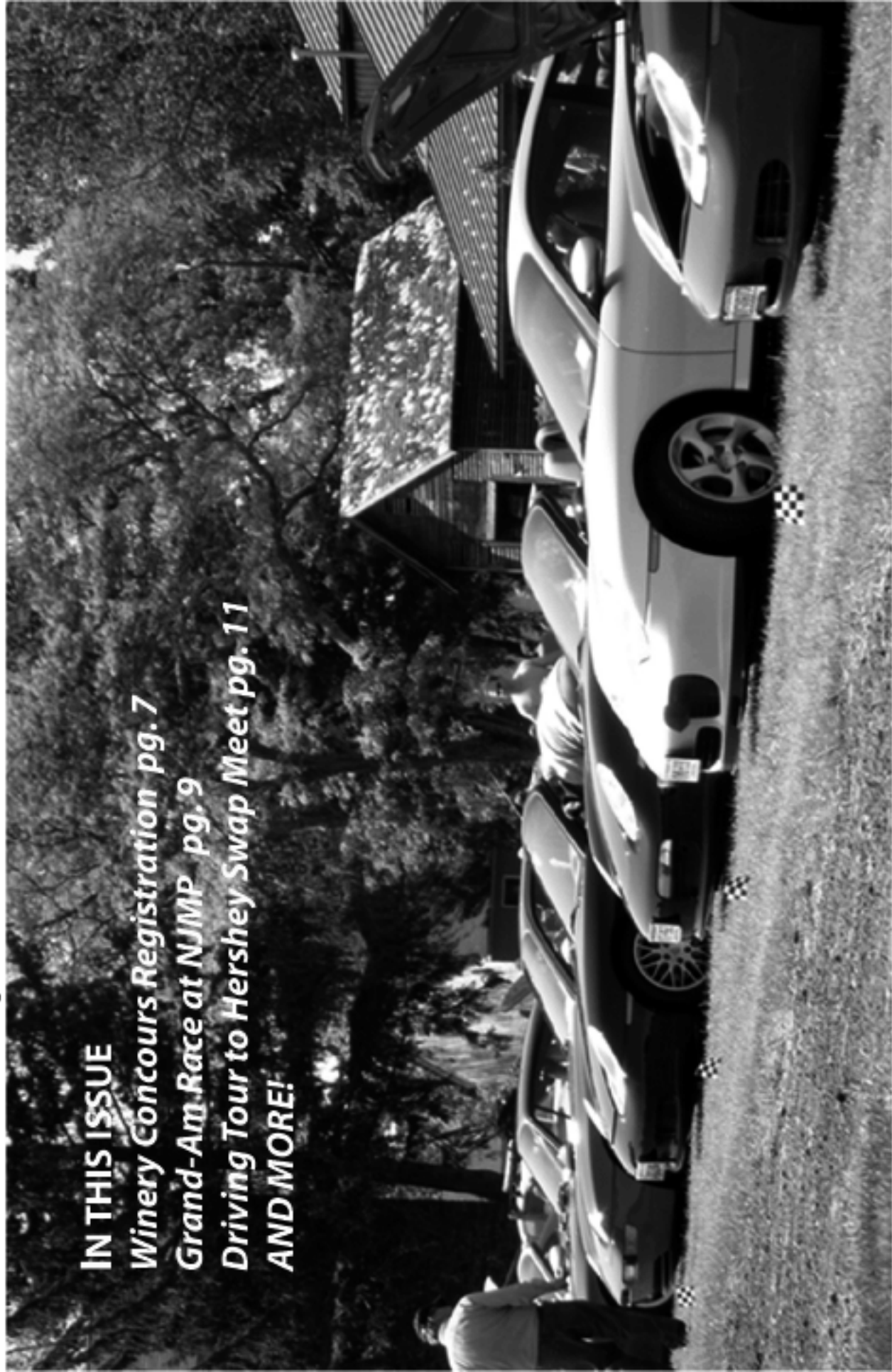

Petch Sez

Buyer beware (another case in-point)

As most members know, I buy and sell a lot of Porsches. I've learned to decipher what a seller states in an ad (either in classifieds or on-line sales or auctions) and determine what their description probably means in terms of the actual condition or characteristics of the car. The Internet has created many opportunities for deception. Here is another case in point.

The eBay auction read "1980 Porsche 911 SC. My childhood dream car and in my opinion one of the coolest and easily recognized cars ever! I planned to keep this car forever and have invested over \$15K into it. Unfortunately loss of income has forced me to sell it. It was a basket case when I bought and I have restored it to about 80-85%. I've sold several vehicles on eBay and have a solid reputation."

The seller gave more information to bolster the sale and to give the impression he is being up-front about the good and bad aspects of the car but this info should be considered as ... well, let's just say not always accurate. Below I've listed the seller's info (bad then good) as provided in the eBay listing in *italics* followed by my comments.

The bad

1. *"The biggest problem at this point is the oil leak. My mechanic told me one of the head gaskets is blown. The only way to fix this is to remove the engine and replace the cylinder gasket. This maybe \$1500-2000 or so depending on where you live, so bid accordingly. Having said that the car runs and idles great. It drives fine if you keep the RPM's low before shifting. If you want to drive it like you stole it you'll get some knocking, mostly at low speeds because extra air is being drawn in past the gasket creating a lean condition. This problem is hardly noticeable at highway speeds due to higher fuel flow. If you don't mind a few oil spots in your driveway and you can drive reasonably sane you can put off the repair for a while, but it will need to be fixed to make the car right."*

DP: If this isn't corrected it will destroy the heads, cylinders and maybe the whole engine. Big-time repair bills will follow.

2. *"There are several items that don't work. The oil pressure gauge, clock, air conditioning, and cruise control. The heater blower motor works, but the heat isn't that great. Small crack in windshield, Most of the weather stripping is shot and will need to be replaced. I've been caught in the rain a few times and never got water in my lap. Wiper motor works, but does not park (return to down position) so you have to time it."*

DP: If I commented on each item with repair costs this article would need to be continued next month. The list would have been shorter if he had listed what works.

3. *"Seats and carpeting are in ok shape, I put seat covers on seats, one of those vinyl kits. Could use a fresh up."*

DP: In other words it needs a completely new interior.

4. *"This car no longer has a catalytic converter- it is not required in Illinois. Check your state laws, you may have to put one back on. No Cat adds about 10 HP, I'm told."*

DP: HP benefit from no cat is the first bit of truth in the ad.

The good

1. *"Engine was rebuilt in 2006 only 7,700 miles on rebuild at a cost of \$9K. Fuel ratio changed and heads ported and polished for more H.P. Performance exhaust added. Motormeister rebuild. Odometer was rebuilt and reset to reflect mileage on engine rebuild."*

DP: Sounds like a bad motor based on earlier stated problems and who rebuilt it. Not to mention the tampered with the mileage (which is a Federal offense).

2. *"Euro transmission with 45K miles on it installed in 2008. The Euro transmission has heavier duty parts, better shifting, and delivers more horsepower to the wheels than the American version."*

DP: This is simply not so.

3. *"Vehicle painted in 2007. Wheels are original and were completely overhauled and repainted."*

DP: Notice he didn't say how or even if the car was prepped before painting (only the wheels) nor does he state how good the paint job looks.

4. *"Getty rear spoiler added in 2008. I will include the original Whale Tail Spoiler with 3rd brake light. Please note I will charge \$100.00 shipping if shipper won't take spoiler. I have included a photo of car with Whale Tail below."*

DP: This is more good news?

5. *"Replaced dash cover, however it needs to be glued down, just haven't gotten around to it. I will include glue."*

DP: He installed a plastic dash that won't stay down and this is good news. His bad news was better news.

6. *"Sound System replaced in 2007. \$1500 invested. Alpine CD MP3 player I-Pod ready. Just plug I-Pod into cable hidden in glove box and you can access all menus on I-pod. Rockford Fosgate 100RMS Amp in trunk. Infinity speakers all around, 2 Kappa's in rear deck. Kenwood KSC-SW1 150Watt Subwoofer. Sounds Great!!!"*

DP: Now we know where most of the \$15,000 invested went.

7. *"Recent Targa top fixed. Door panels replaced with after market products."*

DP: More nails in the coffin.

8. *"Always Garaged"*

DP: Why?

This sounds like a typical "eBay car". I have heard over 1000 on-line Porsche sales stories in the last 5 years and only two have been good. It's a safe bet that this deal will not have a good ending for the buyer.

As I have said in the past, *If a Porsche needs to be sold on eBay it likely isn't much of a car. Buyer beware...*

Bang for the Buck

Here is a list of up-grades that can be useful for track events or just to improve your Porsche's performance. I've separated them so there are three in a group with each item in its group having approximately equal value.

1. Performance tires (R rated)
2. Performance brake pads & racing quality fluid
3. Driving shoes
4. Wider wheels
5. Race seats and belts
6. Smaller steering wheel
7. Performance shock packages
8. Larger anti-sway bars
9. Stiffer torsion bars, hard bushings
10. Performance exhaust system
11. Brake hardware up-grades (calipers, etc)
12. Reducing weight of the car
13. Spoilers and splitters
14. Transmission re-gearing
15. Larger rims (17" - 19")
16. Roll Bar / cage
17. Suspension camber plates and aids
18. Engine enhancements to provide more HP

I listed the up-grade groups generally in the order of what will provide the most bang for your buck. Note where the horsepower upgrades are listed (i.e., low on the list as they are relatively expensive), yet the novice often chooses to do these first.

TECH INSPECTIONS FOR DE

A technical safety inspection must be completed on cars entered in Schattenbaum Drivers Education events. A completed tech form, available on the website (www.schattenbaum.org), is required for each event. We recommend the inspection be performed no earlier than 2 weeks prior to the event. Tech inspections can be performed by any authorized Porsche dealer, selected private repair facilities, and designated individuals (see list below). Some repair facilities will charge for tech inspections if you are not a regular customer. Please inquire about costs at the location of your choice.

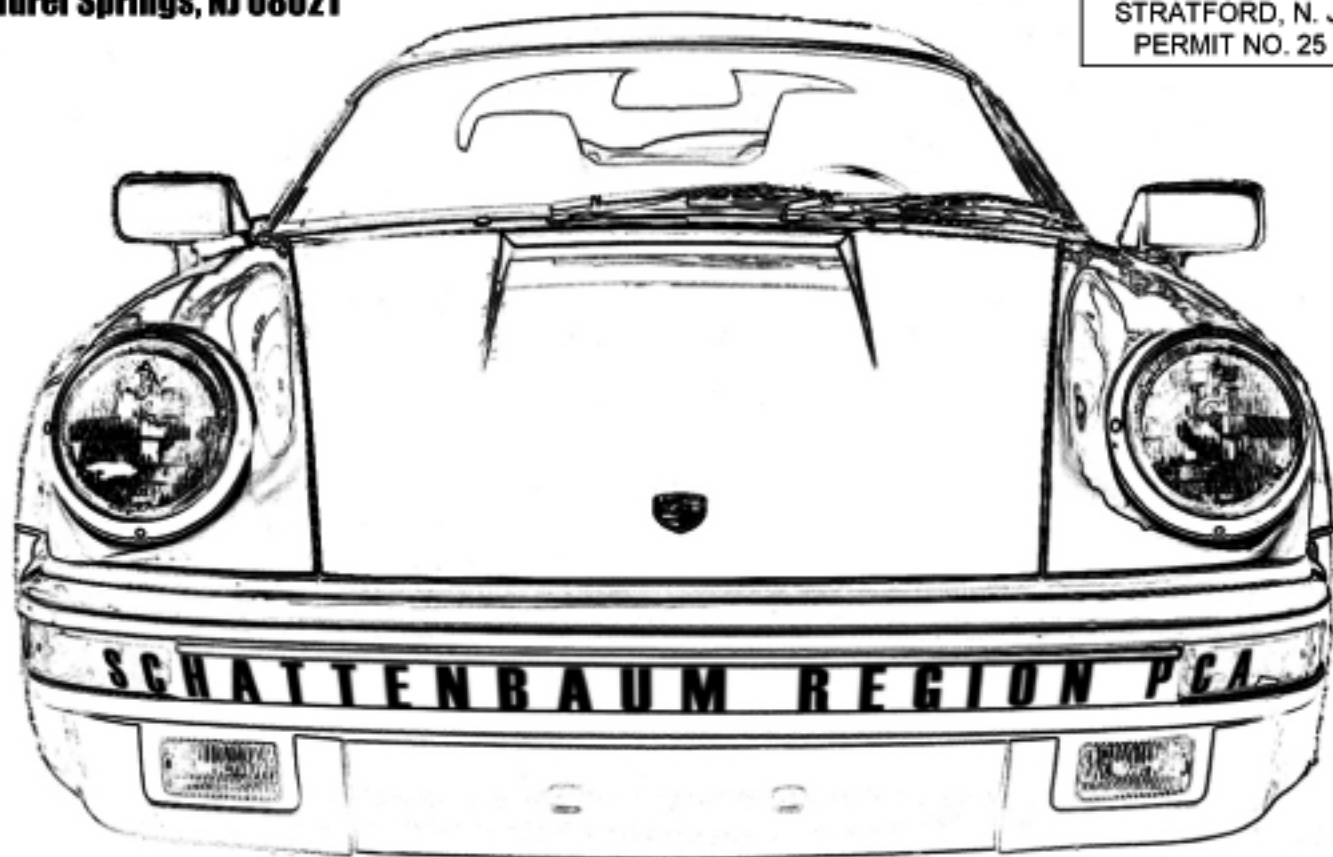

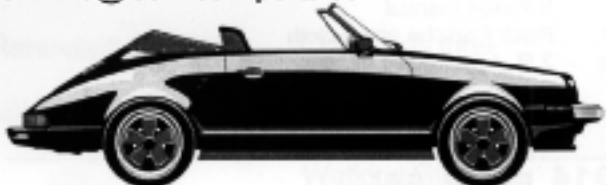
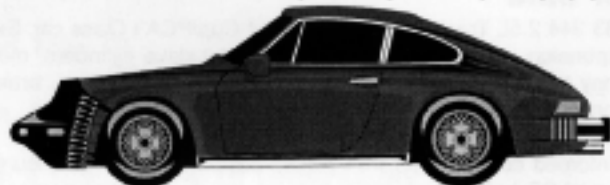
